ORDINANCE NO. 133

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TRAFFIC AND REGULATING THE USE OF A PUBLIC STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF HOMETOWN, TOWNSHIP OF RUSH, KNOWN AS OAK LANE.

WHEREAS, because of existing traffic conditions on Oak Lane and the congestion of traffic on said street resulting from the existing two-way traffic thereon, it is enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Rush Township as follows:

SECTION 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Rush Township and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that all traffic using Oak Lane between Wyoming Street and No Name Alley (commonly referred to as Bnosky Street) shall proceed in one direction only, to wit, northwardly from No Name Alley (Bnosky Street) to Wyoming Street. It is meant hereby that traffic on Oak Lane between the intersecting streets as above referenced for a distance of 150 feet, more or less, shall be one way only, as above set forth, and traffic proceeding in the opposite direction is hereby prohibited.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance for any person to cause, allow, or permit any vehicle to proceed in any other direction upon Oak Lane than as specified in this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. Any person, firm or corporation, association, or organization violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon

conviction before a Justice of the Peace or Magistrate, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars and the cost of prosecution for each offense.
