AN ORDINANCE laying-out, adopting, naming and taking over certain streets and roads in the Barnesville Section of Rush Township; fixing the lengths, widths and termini thereof, and ordaining the same to be Township Roads.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Rush Township, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 1947, P.L. 1481, Section 15 &c. (53-PS-66-101) as amended, and it is hereby enacted and ordained as follows:

SECTION I: The following streets or roads are hereby laid out, opened, adopted, taken over, ordained and named as follows:

- FOREST AVENUE, thirty three (33') feet in width and extending from a paved portion of said road one hundred eighty (180') feet to the East side of Maple Avenue.
- MAPLE AVENUE, fifty (50°) feet in width and extending from the boundary line between Rush and Ryan Townships three hundred sixty eight (368') feet to Forest Avenue.

SECTION II: The provisions of this ordinance shall be severable, and if any of its provisions, or any part of any provision shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to the legislative intent that this ordinance would have been adopted if such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid provision had not been includ-

ed herein.

SECTION III: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
