RESOLUTION NO. 9021-11

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2020, the State Legislature passed Act 57 of 2020, which, among other provisions, requires Rush Township to report to the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission (MPOETC) when a police officer separates from his/her employment with Rush Township; and

WHEREAS, Rush Township typically employs several individuals as part-time police officers, who don't all work consistent shifts; and

WHEREAS, sometimes an individual employed by Rush Township as a part-time police officer remains technically employed long after he/she has in fact left such employment, but has not officially announced an intention to resign; and


WHEREAS, due to the nature of part-time employment as a police officer, it is not always clear when an individual has technically separated from his/her employment therefrom, thus it is not always clear when Rush Township's obligation to notify MPOETC of such separation is triggered;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED:

When a part-time police officer in the employ of Rush Township has not worked a shift for a period of 90 days, Rush Township may consider said officer to have separated from his/her employment with Rush Township thus triggering Rush Township's duty to notify MPOETC of the separation.
